

## Dress Code for GISS students

### Daily school attire

<b>A: Hair:</b>	No limitations to length and colour. Hairstyle must not endanger sight and safety.
<b>B: Earrings:</b>	Must not impact negatively upon safety.
<b>C: Piercing:</b>	Must not impact negatively upon safety. Individually, upon discussion with the school principal.
<b>D: Jewellery and Makeup:</b>	No limitations, however discretion and restraint is desirable.
<b>E: Upper attire:</b>	No singlet styles. Upper body, back, shoulders and stomach must be completely covered. The décolletage must not be visible. Underwear must not be visible. It is not permitted to wear clothes with words or images that are considered offensive.
<b>F: Lower attire:</b>	Pants may be worn short or long. Skirts, shorts and dresses must not be shorter than a hand-width above the knee. Underwear must not be visible.
<b>G: Shoes:</b>	Shoes must be enclosed at the back for safety. Thongs, high heels or stilettos are not permitted for safety reasons.

Any student breaching these rules will be provided with appropriate clothes and has to wear these for the remainder of the school day.

The dress code for teachers is according to the teacher handbook:

“Teaching staff are expected to follow the professional standards expected by teachers in Australia.”

- no spaghetti straps
- thongs are permitted, as long as they are not beach wear
- skirts and shorts should be no shorter than a hand-width above the knee

**Note that teachers on duty are subject to the same rules as students.**

## **Dress Code – Hat:**

When must a hat be worn?

- Before school
- During the first big (morning tee) break (recess)
- During the second break (lunch)
- After school, while students wait for the bus
- On excursions

Students may have their own hat of choice in style and colour as long as the following criteria are met: All students must wear a hat with a sunshade which protects their face. Hoodies and beanies are not an acceptable substitute

Primary school (classes K-6) :

- Primary school classes (K-6) must wear their hats all year. Every class have their own colours.

### **Seasonal exceptions:**

High school (classes 7-12) :

- High school students (7-12) must wear a hat from October through to April (terms 4 and 1)

### **For breaching of the rules:**

Any student breaching these rules will be sent to the No Hat Area. (No mobile phones, No visits, No Talking)

## **Dress Code – Excursion:**

- A school shirt / jacket has to be worn on all excursions
- A hat must be worn during excursions

### **For breaching of the rules:**

Any student who cannot provide a replacement will be excluded from the excursion.

## **Dress Code - Sport:**

- No singlet styles. Upper body, back, shoulders and stomach must be completely covered. Décolletage and underwear must also be covered.

- Suitable shorts or training pants should be worn. Hotpants are not permitted.
- Student will be provided with sports clothes if they have forgotten to bring their own.
- Inside the gym, proper non-marking sport shoes must be worn.
